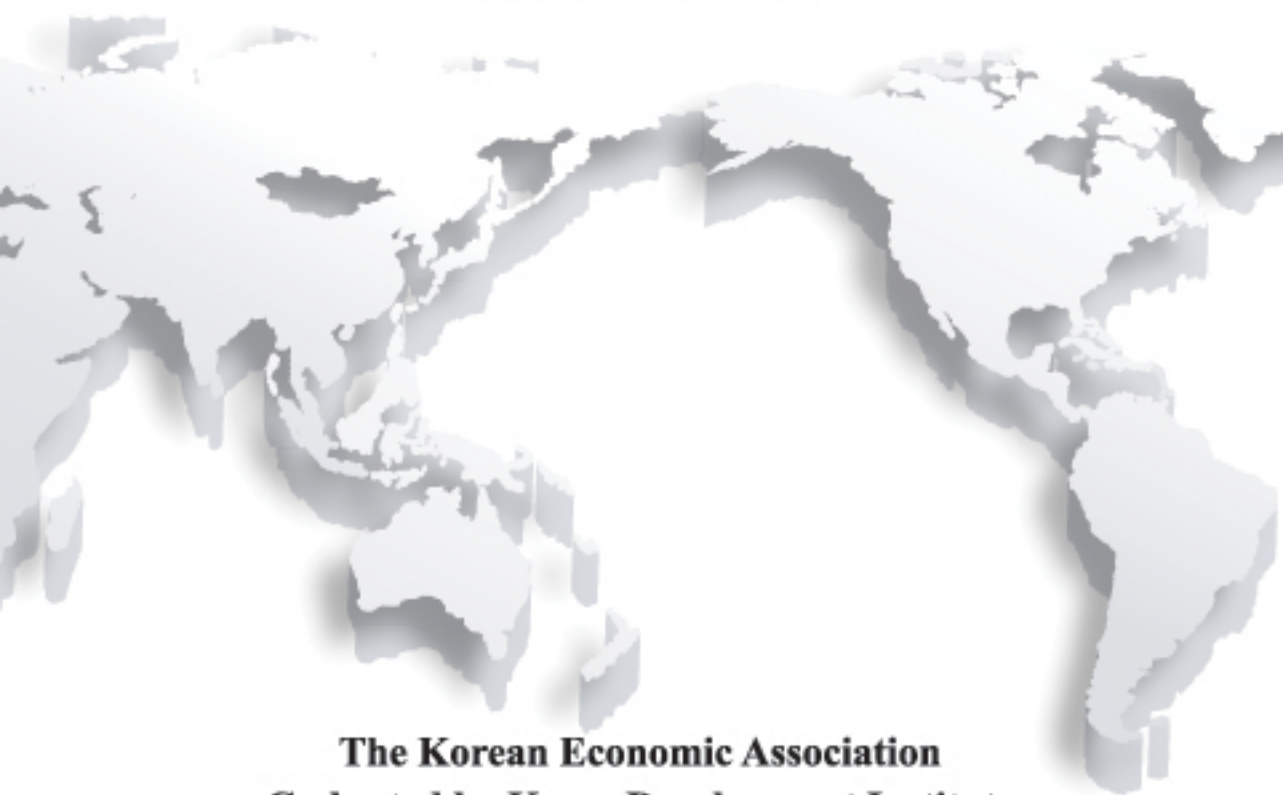

Welcoming Remarks

Distinguished Guests, Eminent Scholars, and Ladies and Gentlemen!

On behalf of the KEA (Korean Economic Association), I would like to welcome you all to the KEA's 16th International Conference.

As the US Fed's tapering is looming, economic uncertainties are increasing around the world. Especially the emerging market economies are now facing a serious problem of the so-called 'the Great Transition' of the sudden capital outflows and economic recession. Japan and the Euro-zone countries are taking expansionary monetary and currency-depreciation measures as a response to the US QE policy. Historically, there seems to be a strong positive relationship between America's higher interest rate policy and regional or global economic crises. After 1990 the US raised the interest rates three times and the Asian countries experienced a currency crisis in 1997 and the entire world suffered from a financial crisis in 2008. Recently the US Fed's Chairperson Janet Yellen has publicly alluded that the US would raise the interest rate a little bit earlier than expected. As a result, the whole world is now cautiously watching for the US Fed's action.

Also the East Asian countries are watching over Japan's three arrows policy-expanding money supply, a massive fiscal stimulus, and structural reforms. These are pursued by Prime Minister Shin-zo Abe. Since last year Japan has been taking Quantitative and Qualitative Easing policy (QQE for short) under Abenomics. Japan is attempting to carry out Abenomics to restore "the Lost 20 years". The East Asian countries, however, are seriously concerned about this because they believe that Abenomics brings about a much weaker yen currency.

We also note with concern that China is trying to pursue a new strategy of soft-landing. China is facing problems of regional growth imbalance and the nation-wide inflation which have been accumulated over a 30 year period of high growth.

With these new developments, the regional economic cooperation among the East Asian countries has entered a new phase. Until recently, the Group of ASEAN+3 had attempted to strengthen regional monetary and financial cooperation by establishing the CMIM, ABMI, etc. However, the geo-political and economic situation in East Asia has turned uncooperative. China is now pursuing the internationalization of the Yuan currency whereas Japan is attempting to conduct the policy of unlimited Yen supply.

The outlook for the financial cooperation in East Asia is not bright. The risk of depreciation competition is increasing in this region. The perspective for regional trade cooperation is not positive either. There has not been a consensus established among the East Asian countries regarding the TPP, RCEP and bilateral FTA.

Korean economy is also facing numerous problems. Prior to the 2008 global financial crisis, Korea experienced high economic growth. Korean economy is now suffering from economic recession and high youth unemployment. The corporate investment has been so low and Korean women's fertility rate is falling and is now the lowest among the OECD countries. Korea's longer-term potential GDP is continuously declining. Given all these new developments, Korea needs to adopt a new growth strategy.

To envision the future shape of the global economic environment and to find solutions to Korea's various problems, the Korean Economic Association has organized the 16th International Conference. More than 300 eminent professors and scholars have been invited to give a paper or to make a comment.

Before closing, I would really like to thank all the paper presenters and other participants.

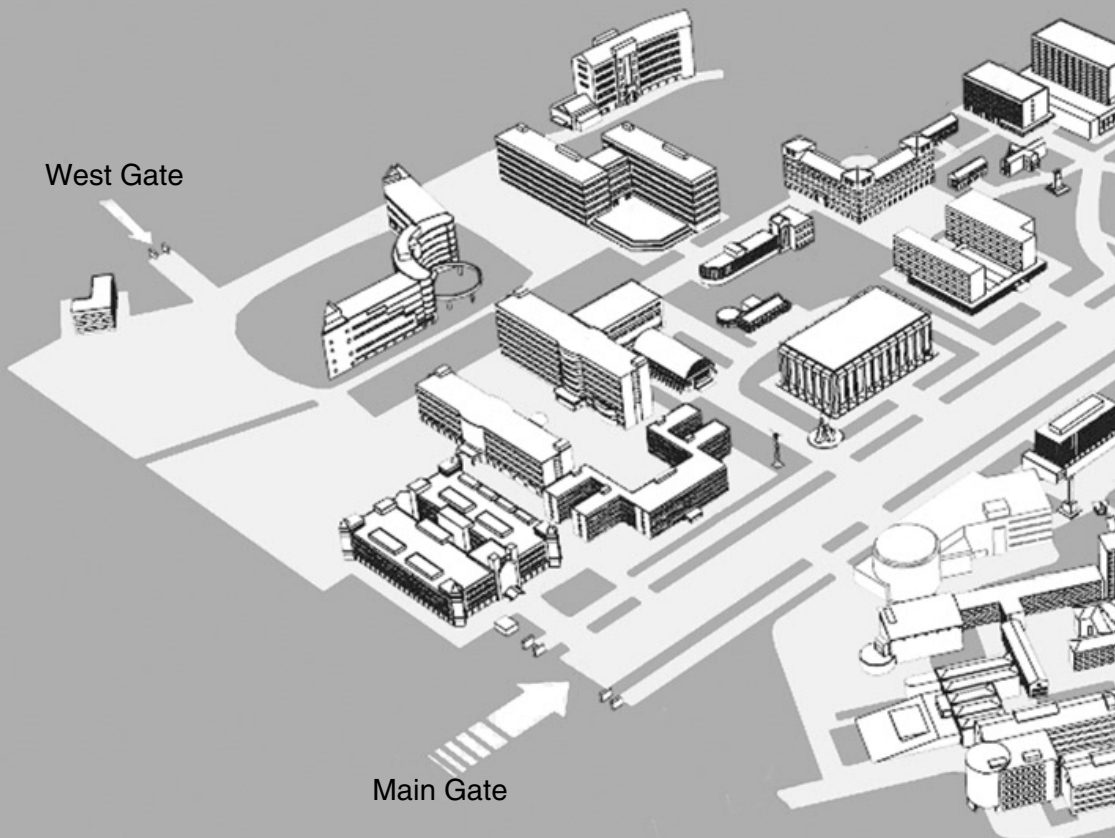
